- Irish Sea
- Atlantic Ocean

We can describe something as being a **human or physical feature**.

A **human feature** is described as a geographical feature that is made by humans. Such as a farm, house or harbour.

A **physical feature** is described as a natural geographical feature that is not made by humans. Such as a mountain and the ocean.

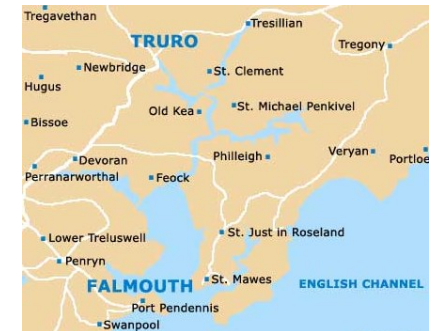

| UK | Short for the United Kingdom |
| Towns | The central part of a neighbourhood with its business or shopping area. |
| Cities | A city is a large important town. They have a cathedral. |
| Seas | The expanse of salt water that covers most of the earth's surface. |
| Country | A nation with its own government, occupying a particular territory. |
| Ocean | A very large expanse of sea. |
| Capital city | The city or town that functions as the sea of government and administrative centre of a country or region. |
