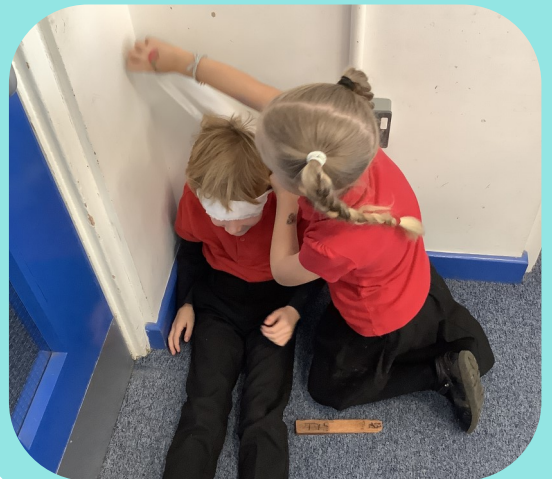
## Turtle Class

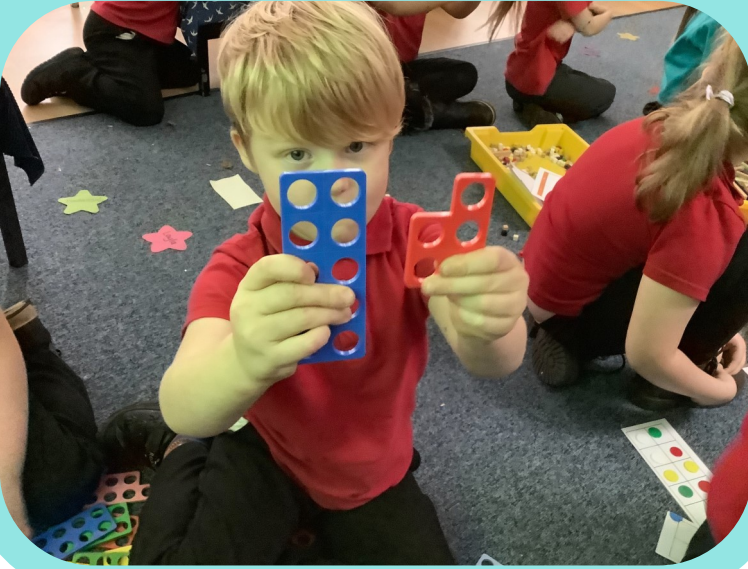
## Wellbeing at Falmouth Primary Academy

Jellyfish were fantastic mathematicians exploring numbers to 20!



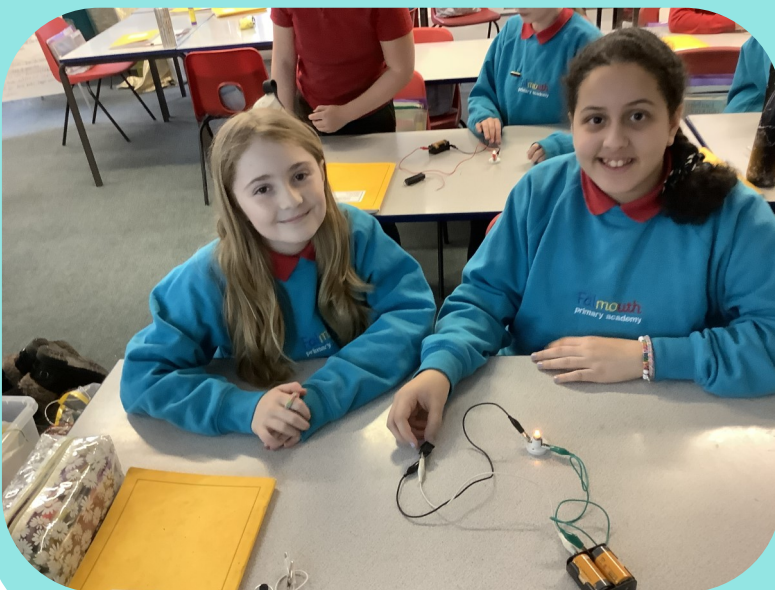
## Limpet Class

Seal class learnt to make circuits including buzzers, light bulbs and switches. We discovered the more buzzers you have in a circuit the quieter they are.



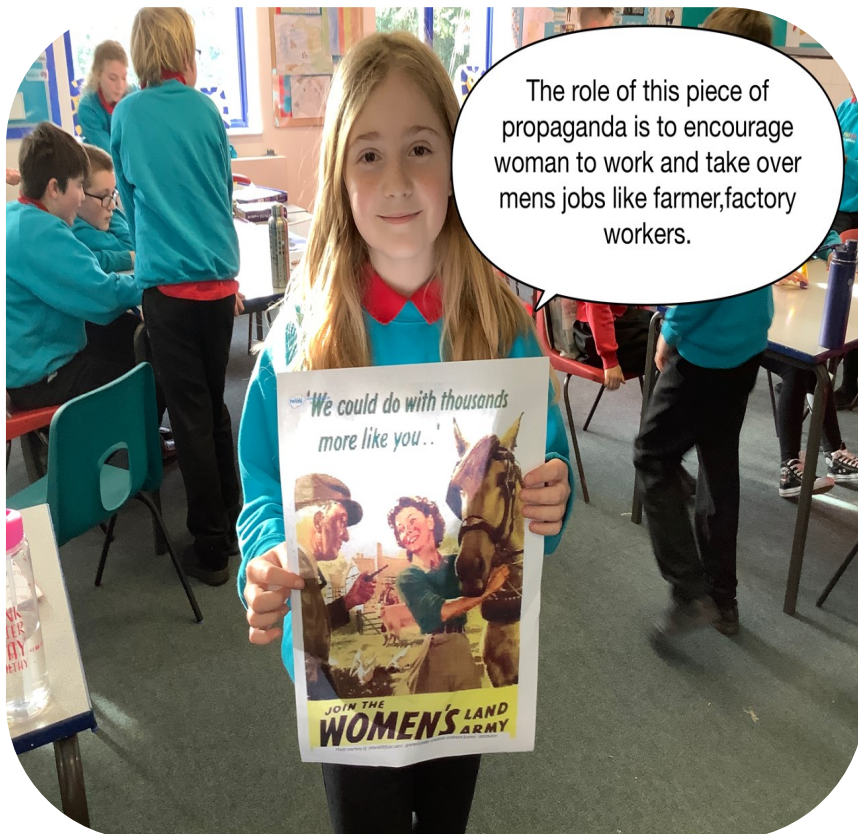
## Seal Class
