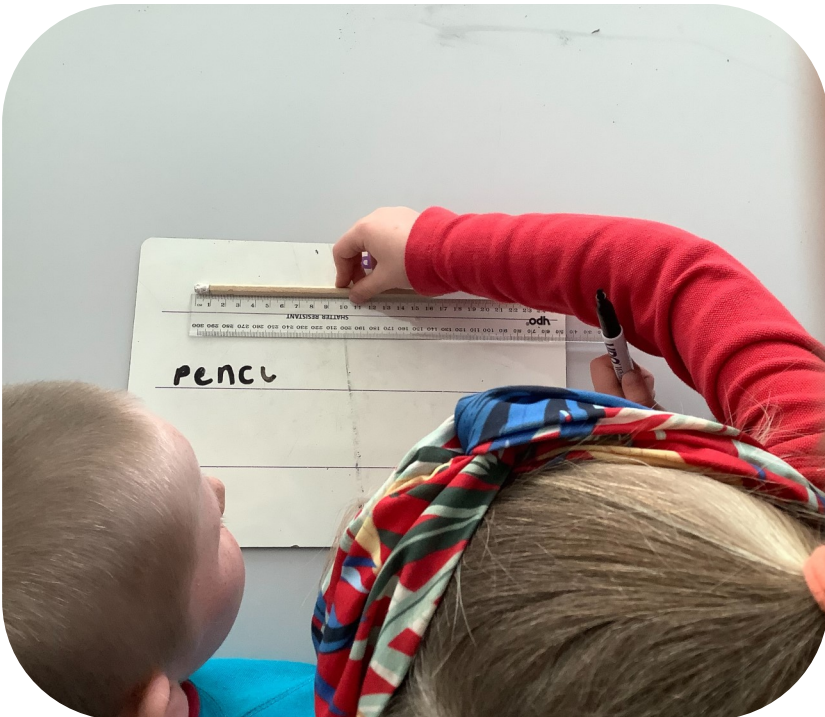
Oyster Class

Oyster class have been learning yoga poses with Mrs Penna. Here they are in Tree pose. And Downward facing Dog. Namaste.



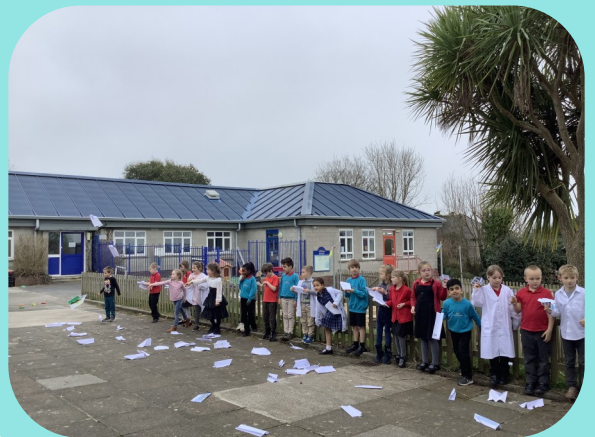
Jellyfish Class

Limpets are inventing today and using explanation texts to test and create working prototype planes. We tested our inventions to see which was best.



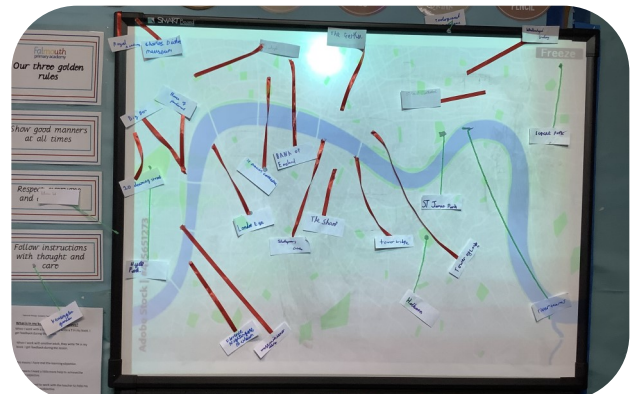
Seahorse Class

Seahorses have been learning about what plants need to grow.; soil, water, sunlight and time. They have been looking after their sun-flower seeds and are excited to see them grow!



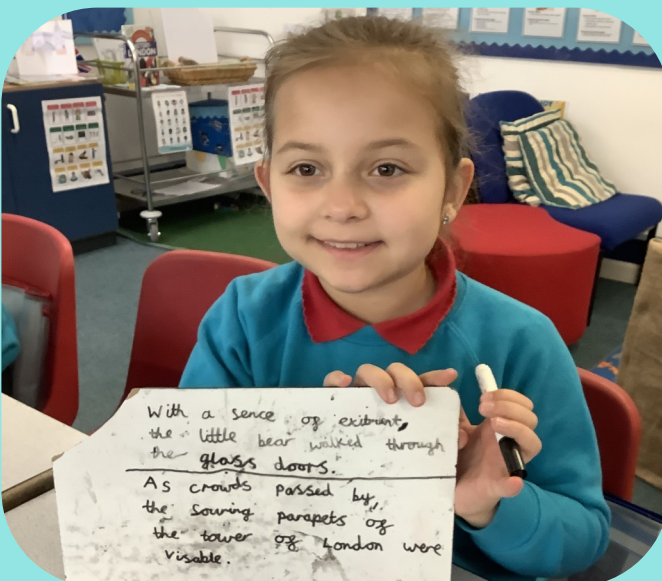
Octopus Class
