### **Basking Sharks**

Y6 have been learning about light and shadow in science. Today, we had to prove that light only travels in a straight line by making it travel through holes in card to hit a target. When we moved one of the pieces of card with a hole in it out of line, the light was blocked by the opaque object. Next, we had to devise a demonstration (that we shared with the class) to prove that light travels in a straight line when it is reflected, too. In pairs, we had a mirror, a torch and a mystery hidden object and we had to reflect light from our torch off the mirror to see and identify the mystery object.
