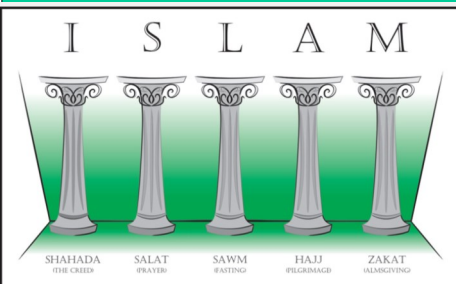
Essential Knowledge

- The Night of Power, for many Muslims is seen as the most important event in history.
- The Night of Power is where the first verses of the Qur'an were revealed to Muhammad.
- Muslims treat the Qur'an with care. They will wash their hands, face and feet before touching it and they will never place it on the floor. Often the Qur'an is placed on a stand rather than the table. When it is not in use they keep it wrapped in cloth to keep it protected.
- The Qur'an is a guide to help Muslims live their lives.
- There are 5 pillars of Islam.
- Muslims can pray anywhere but they are meant to pray towards Mecca.
- Some Muslims pray 5 times a day. They will pray at dawn, after midday, afternoon, sunset and night time.
- Muslims pray so they are close to Allah. It allows them to communicate with Allah and follow in the footsteps of the prophets.



Vocabulary

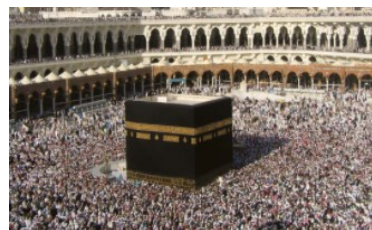
The Qur'an	The Muslim holy book. It is a guide to help Muslims live their lives.
Ibadah	This means 'worship'. Muslims try to make all parts of their lives an act of worship to Allah, since he is their creator.
Worship	To show a lot of love or adoration for something.
Five Pillars	The five pillars represent the core beliefs and practises of Islam.
Shahadah	A statement that Muslims declare to show what they believe.
The Night of Power	The night where Muhammad received the first verses of the Qur'an from the Angel Jibril.
PBOH	Peace be upon him
Obey	To follow or carry out a command.
Gratitude	To be thankful, and have the readiness to show appreciation.
